HISTORY

In 1998, Dr Richard Byng at the Rushey Green Group Practice instigated the idea of a Time Bank. In 1999, in partnership with the New Economics Foundation the Time Bank was piloted as an innovative way to promote wellbeing, health, social inclusion and social capital locally. Dr Byng was convinced that increasing their contact with other people could help many of his patients who presented themselves with symptoms of depression and isolation. He also hoped to find a framework in which they could feel useful to society and needed by others. In 2003, the 3 year pilot project, where the Rushey Green Time Bank had been funded and managed by the New Economics Foundation came to an end. Management of the project was handed over to staff, and a steering group consisting of time bank members and the Rushey Green Group Practice was formed. In 2004, Rushey Green Time Bank become a registered charity.

CORE VALUES

ASSETS: Time Banking values people and recognises that everyone has something special to offer others knowledge, skills and time. Every human being has the capacity to be a contributor.

REDEFINING WORK: Work must be redefined to include whatever it takes to raise healthy children, build strong families, care for the frail and vulnerable, make neighbourhoods safe and vibrant, make democracy work, advance social justice.

RECIPROCITY: Giving and receiving are the basic building blocks of positive relationships, and health communities. Wherever possible, we must replace one-way acts of generosity in whatever form with two-way transactions. "You need me" becomes "We need each other".

SOCIAL CAPITAL: Belonging to a community or a social network gives our life more meaning, more quality and can rebuild trust between people. Networks are stronger than individuals. Social Networks require on-going Investments of social generated by trust, reciprocity and civic engagement.

RESPECT: Respect underlines freedom of speech, freedom of religion, and everything we value. Respect supplies the heart and soul of democracy. We must respect where people are in the moment, not where we hope that will be at some future point.


